ART of Glass 2

Art of Glass 2 is a regional cultural partnership that will bring the best in glass art from around the world to Southeastern Virginia in spring 2009. The major partners, Chrysler Museum of Art, Contemporary Art Center of Virginia and Virginia Arts Festival, are joined by more than 20 regional affiliates in this glass exhibition that will showcase Hampton Roads as the center for glass art on the East Coast.

In 1999, the same group of partners joined to present the original *Art of Glass*, the most ambitious arts festival ever staged in Hampton Roads. The event attracted more than 150,000 visitors and gained international attention. The exhibition demonstrates what can be accomplished when cultural organizations from across the region join together. We expect the response to *Art of Glass 2* to be even more impressive.

At the core of **Art of Glass 2** is a series of major exhibitions at the Chrysler Museum of Art and the Contemporary Art Center of Virginia and glass-theme performances presented under the auspices of the Virginia Arts Festival. **Art of Glass 2** will feature some of the most spectacular and beautiful works of glass art being produced in the world today along with events and educational programs.

The Virginia Arts Festival will feature a Chamber Music Concert Series, as well as Organ Recitals, in venues throughout the region that have stained glass windows with historic or artistic significance. The festival will also feature a mobile glass blowing studio, or hot shop, outside their major venues before and after all performances, including the spectacular Virginia International Tattoo. In addition, there will be more than 20 Affiliate exhibitions of glass art presented by various institutions throughout the region. The Suffolk Center for Cultural Arts is mounting a monumental exhibition, *All in*



the Family, that will feature some of the most prominent glass-making families in the world, such as the Littletons, Marionis, Moores, Marquises, and many others.

In Williamsburg, the Muscarelle Museum will feature the important glass artistry of Louis Comfort Tiffany. Exquisite pieces from collections across the country will form the core of this exhibition. Other venues, such as the d'Art Center in Norfolk, will focus on the work of one artist, Stephen Powell. His work is whimsical, colorful and exciting.
